The Organisation

Tamer Institute works primarily with and for children and youth, providing safe and friendly learning environments and materials. *Tamer Institute* runs a publishing unit, holds intellectual events for teachers and librarians, arranges workshops, leads youth teams, facilitates community initiatives, donate books to local libraries and arranges an annual reading campaign. The institute identifies the most critical need as to acquire means to help people learn and become engaged in their communities. *Tamer Institute* focuses principally on the rights to education, identity, freedom of expression, access to information and promotes all forms of expression on national and international levels. Eventually *Tamer Institute* is working to realize social change by contributing to a Palestinian environment that is supportive to learning processes and supporting the literary and scholarly production on child culture in Palestine.
